Has a minimum of 4 youth members aged 16- 30 years old that reflect the many forms of diversity in the youth community, along with a CFI board representative and the Youth Program Leader.

#3

Holds an annual orientation for all new members and encourages all members to participate in training opportunities that will strengthen their skills in philanthropy and grant making.

#4

Assess critical issues in the area of youth at least every three years.

#5

Engages in a grant making process that is responsive to the critical issues in the area of youth annually.

#6

Interacts with The Community Foundation for Ireland board, staff and stakeholders at least once a year.

#7

Has activities highlighted by The Community Foundation for Ireland's annual report, website, newsletter, public presentation and other communication tools.

#8

Conducts an annual self- assessment to reflect upon its strengths, challenges, use of best practices and opportunities for improvements.
