Supporting Children Through Times of Crisis

The generosity of viewers of *The Late Late Toy Show* is transforming young lives in communities in every county. A remarkable achievement at any-time but particularly when so many are grappling with the cost-of-living crisis.

Despite the challenge of stretched household budgets families who gathered on the last Friday in November to watch the highlight of the television calendar dug deep raising €4 Million.

The impact of which has been scores of projects which are strategic and transformative with an ability to make significant positive change.

Not only does it mark a third successful appeal but also a unique coming together to respond to the needs facing children right across the country.

A unique event with viewers giving what they can to support not only family, friends and neighbours but also strangers living in their communities.

Supporting 1.2 Million Children

The figures are remarkable. Once again 1.2 Million Children and their families supported with 147 grants bringing the total since the first appeal in 2020 to 359 grants. As impressive as they are these totals do not tell the full story of the RTÉ Toy Show Appeal and the impact it has every day of the year.

This appeal is about putting food on the table or a roof over the head of a child who has no place to call home, supporting children scarred by the trauma of war as well as bringing the joy, energy and colour of the arts to children living with a disability. The impact is huge. Informed by those working on the ground in communities as well as the leading child advocates in the country, grants were distributed under three themes; Essential Needs, Health and Wellbeing as well as Play and Creativity

Cost of Living Crisis

The themes allow the appeal to respond to emerging challenges fuelled by the cost-of-living crisis. Grants under Essential Needs are being used to give practical supports to those families who them most.

Children and young people at the centre of the homeless crisis are being traumatised – not knowing where they will be sleeping from night to night is deeply unsettling and disruptive. The appeal has allowed the provision of counselling supports for those forced to live in emergency accommodation.

Food banks and other centres are being supported to allow parents to put food on the table. In terms of overcoming rising bills and costs case workers have been put in place to help people find a way to make ends meet. New mothers in vulnerable situations such as Direct Provision Centres are being assisted with needs such as nappies and push chairs.

Children of War

In addition to those children trapped in the asylum system, communities across Ireland continue to support and shelter families fleeing for their very survival. The impact of the war in Ukraine has seen tens of thousands of people seeking safety in Ireland.

Children, many of whom arrived with little or no knowledge of Ireland and only the most basic English, quickly have been adapting not only to a strange land but also to new schools and new friends.

Whether after school home-work clubs in Shannon, creative clubs in Sligo, sports days in West Cork or trauma supports across the country the Toy Show Appeal has allowed local actions which are bringing comfort and support to the children of war.

Health and Wellbeing

Many other children face trauma and challenges. With a focus on health and wellbeing the appeal ensures children no matter what their circumstances will benefit. From providing equine therapy to children living in violent homes in the Midlands to liquid therapy from access to surfing in Donegal, the Appeal is promoting alternative supports which are transforming young lives.

Cope Galway is working with 200 homeless children in emergency accommodation providing health and education programmes.

Creativity and Play

Imagination is at the very centre of the RTÉ Toy Show, so it is fitting that once again the Appeal adopted Creativity and Play as a theme in its third year. Bringing colour, excitement and energy into young lives is what makes this appeal unique amongst all others. It is the instigator and the driver of many projects allowing community groups and organisations to plan bigger and bolder.

The Crann Centre in Wexford, Limerick Youth Services and LARCC Cancer Support in Roscommon are just three of the projects focusing on bringing the arts to children living with illness or disabilities. Special play therapy facilities as well as art and creativity programmes have been made possible through the appeal.

Local Impact

The projects highlighted in this report can only ever tell part of the story. What viewers can be assured of is that young lives in their county are being improved in many ways. Often unique programmes and projects are made possible which otherwise either would not happen or be unable to reach so many children.

At Community Foundation Ireland we are proud of our partnership with the RTÉ Toy Show Appeal.

As a philanthropic hub we have access to the insights which allow us to identify where the need is greatest as well as those issues which require an urgent response. That knowledge and agility gives us the ability to turn the generosity of viewers into action and to change children's lives for good.

On behalf of the Foundation we want to thank all who make the RTÉ Toy Show Appeal happen, in particular the viewers who each year respond to a uniquely Irish night of incredible television to create magic.

2023 Toy Show Appeal Grants

Awarded from the €4million raised in the 2022 *Late Late Toy Show*

The lives of children across Ireland were improved in multiple ways through 147 RTÉ Toy Show Appeal grants which were made possible by the generosity of viewers of last November's *Late Late Toy Show*.

The response once again from *Late Late Toy Show* viewers to the appeal will help transform the lives of an estimated 1.2 million children, young people and their families, with every county on the island benefitting from grants totalling almost €4 million.

Grants are being provided under three main areas of support:



Addressing Essential Needs

Addressing Essential Needs assists those children in every country who face the greatest challenges.

Projects include: afterschool care to children at risk of food poverty, improving the lives of children in emergency accommodation (Galway), and the development of specialist resources for children with Down Syndrome.



Health and Wellbeing

Health and Wellbeing focuses on supporting children facing living with health challenges or disabilities. In total over €1.9M is being awarded this year to provide health, disability supports, mental wellbeing and therapy services for more than 100,000 children and their families.

Grants include: funding a developmental trauma intervention for the Irish Foster Care Association, supports for children with a cancer diagnosis (Cavan), therapeutic care services (Kerry) and monthly home care support hours for children with life-limiting illnesses (nationwide).



Creativity and Play

Creativity and Play will bring colour, creativity and fun into young lives all over Ireland, many of whom have faced serious adversity.

Examples include: Exploring the World of Languages is a programme which will engage pre-school children (nationwide), the provision of musical instruments for children traumatised by the war in Ukraine (Mallow), the upscaling of a palliative care unit (Cork), and the creation of the first accessible surf centre for children with disability (Donegal).

RTÉ Toy Show Appeal



The monies raised were made available as grants to registered charities who work to improve children's lives by an open application process, managed on behalf of RTÉ by Community Foundation Ireland.

Founded in 2020, the RTÉ Toy Show Appeal has raised over €17.5m for children's charities to date. Over the past three years 359 grants have been provided to 226 children's charities across the island of Ireland. It is estimated that the Appeal has helped over 1.2million children and family members annually since its inception. Community Foundation Ireland has been the charity partner of the RTÉ Toy Show Appeal since its establishment in 2020.

Over 20 years in existence, Community Foundation Ireland works with individuals, families, companies, and other trusts and foundations to support a diverse range of not-for-profit organisations.

Since 2000 Community Foundation Ireland has awarded over €120 million in grants. Community Foundation Ireland is a registered charity, (Registered Charity Number (RCN): 20044886) and is committed to the highest standards of trust and governance. Community Foundation Ireland and its partners believe in equality for all in thriving communities. They work with individuals, families, corporates and other trusts and foundations as well as Government to translate giving in the moment to giving that is strategic, sustainable and impactful.

Key theme 1

Cost of Living Crisis

The cost-of-living crisis has been impacting children and young people, particularly those who are more marginalised in society. The RTÉ Toy Show Appeal has stepped up by providing funding for:

- Food provision and case workers to support families to overcome the issues they face as a result of increased costs
- Counselling and family support for children in homeless emergency accommodation
- Providing essential items such as nappies and pushchairs to new mothers in Direct Provision

Key theme 2

Ukraine War

Ireland has welcomed more than 70,000 refugees from Ukraine, many of them children. The RTÉ Toy Show Appeal has been providing funding to support Ukrainians settle into new schools, make new friends and to overcome war trauma. Projects include:

- Afterschool clubs in Shannon to support children complete homework and participate in art classes
- Creative programmes in Sligo to improve wellbeing, self-esteem and resilience
- Counselling for young people in Direct Provision and from Ukraine in Leitrim.

Grants were made available against the following three themes in the following categories:

- Addressing Essential Needs
- Health and Wellbeing
- Play and Creativity

Community Level Grants

Grants of €5,000 up to €25,000 were made available to eligible organisations (with a turnover of less than €500,000) that can demonstrate the impact of their work at local and community level.

The 2022 RTÉ Toy Show Appeal raised more than €4,000,000 which was granted to 133 children's charities in Ireland and 14 in Northern Ireland.

Through an Open Grant Round, charities were invited to apply for funding through the Community Round (up to €25,000) or through the Impact Round (up to €75,000).

The Community Round supported 79 charities across the island of Ireland to support the most vulnerable and marginalised children and young people at a local level. With RTÉ Toy Show Appeal funding, charities are providing Community Food Banks for children impacted by the cost-of-living crisis, afterschool homework clubs for children from the Traveller Community and adventure activity programmes for young people with disabilities.

The Impact Grant Round supported 68 charities across the island to make profound and long-term impact for children and young people. This includes creative therapeutic supports for children who have faced domestic violence, wellbeing programmes for children who are undergoing cancer treatment and essential items for children seeking asylum in Ireland.



Donegal – Donegal Family Resource Centre CLG – Awarded **€15,000** for essential creative play and sensory equipment, and safe spaces for children and young people in rural Donegal

Antrim and Newtownabbey – Sensory Kids – Awarded **£10,000** for its Creative Specialist Play Programme which supports vulnerable children and mums



Monaghan – The Down Syndrome Centre North East – Awarded **€18,000.00** to provide a comprehensive Early Intervention programme for **50 children** with Down syndrome aged 0 – 6 years old

Belfast – Newstart Education Centre – Awarded **£47,750.00** for its early intervention programme that will improve the emotional and physical well-being of 30 young people.

Sligo – West Sligo Family Resource Centre – Awarded **€20,000** to provide creative programmes for personal growth, resilience, and wellness, for **250 children and refugees** from Ukraine

Louth – Drogheda Women's and Children's Refuge Centre Clg. – Awarded **€44,000** to employ an activity worker to provide support services for more than **100 disadvantaged children** so they have a safe space to engage in programmes and extra curricula activities.

Limerick – Dóchas Midwest Autism Support – Awarded **€11,0000** for developing Art and Lego Play Therapies for more than **60 Children** and Young People with Autism to reduce anxiety and build important personal skills.

Meath – Meath Springboard Family Support Services – Awarded **€58,000** to provide timely and affordable therapies to more than **100 children** who have additional psychological, emotional and behavioural needs



Cork – Feed Cork – Awarded **€15,000** its after school fuel programme that delivers healthy meals every weekend to **150 DEIS school children** who are at risk of food poverty.



Dublin – Citywise Education – Awarded **€55,000** to run less formal educational programme for Transition Year students in low socio-economic areas that inspires and provides the tools to support young people in accessing third level education.

Tipperary – Compass Child and Family Services – awarded **€45,000** to provide outdoor play and recreational facilities to vulnerable children and those who have faced trauma

Westmeath – New Horizon – Athlone Refugee & Asylum Seeker Support Group – Awarded **€12,000** to run the New Horizon Summer School for young asylum seekers and refugees to help them prepare for second level education and have better opportunities

Wexford – The Crann Centre CLG – Awarded **€58,000** to deliver a year-round programme of outdoor play, artistic pursuits, performances and fun for children and families living with neuro-physical disabilities





Addressing Essential Needs

Grants within this category of funding are intended to ensure that more children are safe, warm, fed and properly supported in addressing educational needs. Through practical support the aim is to improve the living conditions, life experiences and outcomes for children who may be at risk of some form of deprivation and increasing educational access for vulnerable children.
