

Circular Economy Innovation Grants Scheme 2025: FAQs

Please read through the following FAQs regarding the Circular Economy Innovation Grants Scheme 2025. If your question is not answered here, please read through the Criteria document. Part One of this document will briefly cover logging into the Grants Portal for the first time. Additional information can be found in the Grantee FAQ document. Part Two will cover any questions you might have about this grant round. If your query is still not answered, please email the Grants Team at info@foundation.ie.

PART ONE

How do I log onto the Grants Portal?

If you have applied to Community Foundation Ireland for funding in the past on behalf of your current organisation, you may already be in our system. You can click on 'Forget your Password', reset your password and then log in with your new details.

If you have <u>never</u> applied for funding before, or you have recently joined your organisation, you may need to register an account to access your <u>Grants Portal</u>. Click 'Register Here' to go through the registration process.

When you log in, you will be able to see all of the previous applications submitted by your organisation and opportunities to apply for funding.

I don't have a password, what should I do?

If you are <u>logging in for the first time</u> but you have received a grant from Community Foundation in the past, you can click 'Forgot Password' where you will be prompted to set a new one.

If you have never applied for a grant in the past, you won't already be on our system, in this case you will need to Register instead.

I've clicked 'Forgot Password' but I haven't received an email, what should I do?

If you haven't received an email to reset your password, email <u>portal@foundation.ie</u> and we can set up a temporary password for you. You will then be prompted to set your own.



I'm registering for the first time and the Grants Portal is saying that I already have an account, what should I do?

If you try to register to the Grants Portal, but our system recognises your email, this means you are already on our system. Instead of registering again, you can go back to the <u>login page</u> and click 'Forgot Password' instead. Once you have reset your password you can log in as normal.

I have logged on to the portal, how do I start an application?

Once you log into the portal, you will see the 'Funding Opportunities' available to you. Listed in the opportunities would be the 'Circular Economy Innovation Grants Scheme 2025'. By clicking on that, you can learn more about the fund and apply for a grant.

Once you start an application and save the first draft, it will be available in your 'Draft Applications' on the portal.

PART TWO

What are the thematic priorities for this grant round?

The grant round is open to applications for projects working on waste prevention in the following thematic areas:

- Plastic Waste
- Construction and Demolition Waste
- Food Waste
- Resources and Raw Materials Waste (Electrical and electronic equipment, textiles, furniture)

Applications to this grant round must be aligned to <u>at least one of the thematic</u> areas identified above.

What are the two strands in this Fund?

In addition to working in one of the 4 thematic areas, applications need to be aligned to one of the two strands:

- 1. Innovation For new solutions
- 2. Scaling Up For scaling up existing solutions

Successful grant applications will clearly exhibit metrics related to the amount of waste that they would be able to divert from landfill.



What do I need to apply to the Innovation Strand?

The Innovation strand is for projects / organisations working on an innovative product, technology, service or methodology to make the work more circular and sustainable.

Applications to this strand should have clear evidence to demonstrate that the proposed idea is not being implemented elsewhere. This can be in the form of market research, evaluations, or formal or informal feedback from beneficiaries.

Applications should contain clear metrics on the amount of waste that they would be able to divert from landfill.

What do I need to apply to the Scaling Up Strand?

The Scaling Up strand is for projects / organisations that want to scale up an existing solution that has been successfully implemented by them for 12 months or more.

Applications to this strand should demonstrate proof of concept for the solution and be able to clearly articulate how this idea / project could be scaled up.

Applications should contain clear metrics on the amount of waste that they would be able to divert from landfill.

How much can my organisation apply for?

Organisations can apply for grants between €40,000 and €50,000.

Please note that this funding will be awarded in four instalments and grantees will need to submit drawdown requests for each instalment after the previous funds have been spent. For example, a grant of \leq 50,000 will be awarded in four instalments of \leq 12,500 each.

<u>Please ensure that your organisation has the capacity to manage such a schedule and any possible delays</u> that might arise. Please also ensure that you take this into account while developing your project plan and timeline.

What types of organisations can apply to the fund?

Eligible organisations can be:

- Non-profit organisations or social enterprises with an annual income of more than €100,000. Organisations do not need to be registered charities.
- Small businesses (For-Profit organisations with fewer than 50 employees) with a gross annual income of more than €100,000.

Can funding go towards staff costs?

Yes. Proposals to this fund can include the proportion of staff time costs specifically related to the project. This also includes new staff salaries required to increase service provision.



Can funding go towards core costs?

No. The fund does not cover ongoing core costs such as insurance, rent, bills, etc. Funding is specifically for project-related expenses.

Can I apply for a project that has already happened?

No, we cannot award funding for projects that have already happened. However, funding may be awarded for ongoing projects, as long as they fall in line with the criteria.

Can I apply for a project that has previously received funding from the Scheme?

Projects that have previously received funding from the Circular Economy Innovation Grants Scheme two or more times are not eligible to apply to this funding round.

Please note that this does not make the organisation ineligible, they can apply again provided it is for a different project.

I have received part-funding for my project from another trust or donor; can I apply to this grant round as well?

Yes, you can apply to the Circular Economy Innovation Grants Scheme 2025 for projects that you have already received part-funding for, but you must state this in your application and provide details of the other funder.

Can I apply for a project that costs more than the amount I can apply for?

Yes, organisations can apply for projects with an overall cost that is larger than the amount applied for. Applicants should demonstrate how they will cover the remaining costs.

Do I need to have a budget planned ahead of time?

Yes. All organisations are required to include a detailed budget breakdown in their grant application, outlining how they plan to allocate the funds if awarded the grant. This breakdown should be as comprehensive as possible as it will be an important part of our assessment process.

If my organisation has already received a grant from Community Foundation Ireland, can I still apply?

Yes, organisations currently or previously funded by Community Foundation Ireland can apply.

However, projects that have previously received funding from the Circular Economy Innovation Grants Scheme two or more times are not eligible to apply to this funding round.



Please note that this does not make the organisation ineligible, they can apply again provided it is for a different project.

What documents should I submit with my application?

All organisations will be required to upload digital copies of the following governance documents when registering on our new portal for the first time:

- Company Certificate of Incorporation or equivalent.
- Signed copy of your Constitution or Memorandum and Articles of Association.
- A bank or credit union account statement header from within the most recent six months.
- Signed annual accounts from the previous two years.
- A current list of your organisation's board/committee members and the date they were appointed.
- Proof of identity for two Trustees/Directors/Committee Members, and proof of address for one of them.

I am not able to submit one or more of my governance documents, what can I do?

We cannot accept applications without all the correct governance documents. If you are having trouble submitting the documents while applying, email us at info@foundation.ie before the deadline, and we may be able to help you upload them from our side. Please be mindful that if you are submitting last minute and are not able to submit your documents, we may not be able to help you before the round closes.

Can I send in my proposal or documents via email or post?

No. All proposals and documentation must be submitted through our online application form.

How will my organisation report on our project's progress?

All grantees will be required to submit a Progress Report at the end of July 2026 and an Outcome Report in January 2027 or July 2027, depending on the length of the project. These reports will be submitted via our online portal.

What is the closing date for applications?

The fund is open for applications from 10^{th} September 2025 and will close at 4pm on 8^{th} October 2025.

When will grants be awarded?

Grants will be awarded at the beginning of January 2026.



When should work begin and end?

Work should begin in January / February 2026 and be completed in 12 - 18 months.
