About the Fund

The Energia Derrysallagh Community Benefit Fund supports community, voluntary, and not-for-profit groups based in close proximity to the Derrysallagh windfarm.

The fund aims to support various community projects within **5 to 10km** of Derrysallagh windfarm. Please note that projects **within 5km will be prioritised**. Projects over 10km from the windfarm will not be considered.

The Fund aims to encourage community engagement, improve community wellbeing, and contribute to biodiversity and the local environment.

Key Information

To be eligible to apply, your organisation must:

- Be non-profit or voluntary
- Have charitable aims and a written constitution
- Be based **within 5-10km** of the Derrysallagh windfarm (**priority will be given to those within 5km**)
- Have an organisational bank account
- Provide all organisational information and governance documents (please see list below). This must be submitted by the application deadline or your application will not be considered.

Please note that only one application per organisation will be accepted, and that this is a competitive fund – not all applicants will be successful.

Priority Areas

Grants of **up to €6,000** are available to encourage local initiatives, such as projects that:

- Promote community engagement and wellbeing, for example through training programmes, community events or social enterprise initiatives
- Foster a shared sense of community identity and connectedness, such as through heritage or arts projects
- Work with potentially vulnerable groups, such as older adults, lone parents, people with disabilities, those in rural isolation
- Support children and young people
- Support members of new communities, or of Traveller communities

The fund is also keen to see applications for environmental projects that:

- Support climate action
- Contribute to biodiversity
- Enhance the local environment

Eligibility

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be a registered charity <u>or</u> a local community / voluntary group • Be willing to share the project story with Energia's media team • Demonstrate the capacity to fulfil the project's proposed timeline and budget • Submit all required governance documents and information • Have a Child Protection Policy (if working with under-18s) • Be situated or primarily active within 10km of the Derrysallagh windfarm 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be located within the immediate vicinity or up to 10km away from the Derrysallagh windfarm (priority given to those within a 5km radius) • Focus on the priority areas as stated above • Have clear, realistic budgets and timelines • Provide clear, concrete evidence of how they will benefit the environment and/or local community • Agree to the terms and conditions, including six-monthly reporting and potential site visits

Governance Requirements

When submitting your application, all organisations will be required to upload digital copies of the following governance documents to our portal:

- **A constitution or memorandum and articles of association:** This must show the mission statement or main objects of the organisation, state that you are a non-profit and include a winding up clause. This document must be signed by two committee members.
- **Committee members:** A list of your organisation's committee members and the dates they were first appointed:
- **A bank statement header:** This must clearly show the account name, BIC and IBAN. Blank out any transactions, as this is purely to verify the account.
- **The organisation's most recent annual accounts:** Organisations with an annual income of less than €100,000 should provide one set of signed accounts for the most recent accounting year. A signed profit and loss account is also acceptable.
- **Note** that organisations with an annual income of over €100,000 must provide additional documents, including committee member IDs and two years of signed annual accounts.

If you submitted these documents previously, please review your "Organisation Profile" on the portal and ensure all information is up to date before submitting this year's application.

If you do not submit the correct governance documents, your application will not be considered for funding.

How to apply

The Fund is open for applications on Monday 1st September and will close on Tuesday 30th September at 5pm. Applicants can apply for a maximum of €6,000.

All applications must meet the criteria above. Any organisation or project that does not meet the criteria will not be successful in this grant round.
